Promotional Schemes: RL TAP

The project envisages to cover reservoir fishery sector with appropriate forward and backward linkages so as to uplift the economic condition of the poverty stricken tribal people of Koraput district. The project aims at upliftment of economic standard of fishermen/ economically backward people organized as PFCS/SHG, through expansion of fish production.

Increasing fish production in large water bodies and thereby raising the socio-economic status and generating employment in the periphery villages of the reservoir.

The project has three-tier infrastructural development approach.

Culture: Production of advanced fingerling in captive nurseries and are allowed to grow in reservoir with naturally available nutrient.

Capture: Fishermen are grouped and provided with adequate quantity of boat and net.

Marketing: Provision of Fish Landing Shed

Training: To improve technical know-how on raising fingerling, production, productivity, conservation and management of resources. Besides on the amicable behavior among the group members.
